Professor Sir David Greenaway, University of Nottingham

Professor Sir David Greenaway took up office as the sixth Vice-Chancellor of The University of Nottingham in 2008.

Sir David was appointed to the University as a Professor of Economics in 1987 and was previously a Dean, a Pro-Vice-Chancellor, and founding Director of the Leverhulme Centre for Research on Globalisation and Economic Policy. He was a member of the Government's Asia Task Force 2004-2014, and a member of its Higher Education Task Force. He is Chair of CASE Europe and a member of the National Centre for Universities and Business Leadership Council. He is also a Deputy Lieutenant of Nottinghamshire.

In 2012, Sir David was made an Honorary Citizen of the City of Ningbo in China and Honorary Fellow of Liverpool John Moores University. In 2013, Sir David completed 'Shape of Training', a national review of the training and professional development of Doctors in the UK, coordinated by the General Medical Council. Sir David received a knighthood for services to higher education in Her Majesty the Queen's Birthday Honours list 2014.

Professor Sarah O'Hara, University of Nottingham

Sarah is currently the Pro Vice Chancellor for Education and Student Experience as well as a Professor of Geography. She is responsible for the delivery of one of the core strategies of the University of Nottingham Strategy 2020, which places students at the heart of the University, and focuses on the personalisation of students' learning experiences and ensuring that they are active partners in their own education.

Prior to taking up her role as Pro Vice Chancellor in 2011 she was an associate Dean of the University of Nottingham Graduate School and Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences. As Pro Vice Chancellor Sarah has held a number of portfolios including Human Resources, Access and Community and Academic Planning.

Sarah studied at the Universities Liverpool, Alberta (Canada), UNAM (Mexico) and Oxford before taking up a lectureships at the University of Sheffield. She joined Nottingham in January 1998. She has taught on a large number of modules ranging from Environmental Issues in the Former Soviet Union to Managing Dryland Environments. But, since taking up her role as Pro Vice Chancellor has focused on PhD and undergraduate project supervision. More recently, however, she delivered a Massive, Open, Online Course (MOOC) via FutureLearn on 'Shale Gas and Fracking: the Politics and Science' to over 9000 students.

Over her career Sarah has acted as an advisor to the UNDP, SDC, FCO as well as the UK and EU government on a number of water related projects and environmental issues. She currently sits on the British Geological Society (BGS) independent Advisory Committee; is an advisor to the Shale Gas Task Force and

a panel member of the Economic & Social Research Council (ESRC) – Celebrating Impact Prize competition.
