### **Post 16**

I would like to introduce myself as the new Head of Post 16 at NUSA. Having spent 9 years at the Nottingham Academy as Head of Business and working closely in Post 16, I have built up a wealth of experience in teaching as well as delivering outstanding results. My goal is to develop Post 16 students into well rounded learners who not only achieve academically but also have opportunities to develop experience and skills to support them later in life.

This year marks a first for NUSA in offering academic A-Levels. The school aims to build on the successes of its vocational offering by offering A Levels in Biology, Sociology, Psychology and Creative Writing. The A Level courses run alongside Level 2 and 3 vocational courses in Business, Art, Health and Social Care, Childcare, Catering and Sport.



### **Sign Language Courses**

Following on from the achievement of year 13 students last year in gaining the level 1 British Sign Language qualification, there are eight students who have progressed onto the part 2 course this year. NUSA students have responded fantastically well to this enrichment opportunity and understand its relevance when studying at an academy, which offers specialist deaf provision. The majority of Year 12 students studying social sciences will also take part in a bespoke deaf awareness course, which will dovetail with their academic studies.

### **National Citizenship Service**

You may have heard NCS advertised on local radio and wondered what it is all about. NCS is open to all 16 and 17 year olds in England and Wales. It helps students build skills for work and life and gives students opportunities to take on new challenges and meet new people.

Participants take part in a week long residential taking part in a range of outward bound activities and challenges. Students then return to complete a 30 hour project aimed at dealing with a local issue they are passionate about. Twenty Post 16 students have applied for a place at NCS and all look forward to taking part in the project.

### **INTU University PSHE links**

NUSA Post 16 has been working closely with the school sponsors Nottingham University and Nottingham Trent University in delivering its PSHE offering to post 16 students. So far year 13 students have taken part in UCAS and personal statement writing workshops. Year 12 have had an insight to university life through representatives from the Universities visiting the school. This will be followed up with a trip to Nottingham Trent University on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> November.
